

Brassica Carinata Crop Insurance What, When and How





Carinata Coverage

- Yield Protection Only
- Coverage by Written Agreement (WA) Only
- A Special Provision under the Canola and Rapeseed Policy
 - Not insurable under the Mustard Crop Provisions

Cultivars of <u>Brassica carinata</u> are eligible for insurance under the Canola and Rapeseed Crop Provisions and are not insurable under the Mustard Crop Provisions; however, <u>Brassica carinata</u> is only insurable by written agreement.



Insurance Availability


- Canola/Rapeseed Program Counties Type/Practice WA
 - Written Agreement if you qualify
 - − Due on or before the Acreage Reporting Date − 1/15 each year
- Non-Program Counties
 - Written Agreement if you qualify
 - − Due on or before the Sales Closing Date − 9/30 each year

*Reference County is used as source for rates, T-yields, planting dates and prices.





Written Agreement Application Requirements

- Signed contract is an additional requirement for Carinata WAs
- Farm, Tract, and Field Numbers
- Name, location, and distance to market (may be on contract, if not must be on application form)
- Normal plant and harvest dates
- Irrigation practice
- 3 years of similar crop experience in the county or area
 - Safflower, wheat, oats, rye, and other small grains
- New Producer: Statement that producer has "never planted the crop in the county or area"
