### Who is AFIA?

  - Center for Veterinary Medicine (CVM)




# Ingredients

- Food = Feed in federal law
- Ingredients must be approved:
  - Food additive (FAP)
  - Generally Recognized as Safe (GRAS)
  - AAFCO Official Publication
    - Common or usual name
    - Ingredient definition
- States will review labels to ensure ingredient is approved



### **AAFCO Ingredient Definitions**

- State laws:
  - Common or usual name
  - Defined in the Official Publication of AAFCO, or
  - Defined by the Commissioner/Director in the state
- FDA conducts safety review
- Definitions and feed terms
- 900 ingredients
  - AAFCO, GRAS, FAPs

#### **AAFCO**

T71.35 Brassica carinata, Solvent Extracted, is the meal obtained after the removal of most of the oil by solvent extraction of *Brassica carinata* seeds. The meal shall contain less than 2.0% erucic acid and less than 30 micromoles of total glucosinolates per gram. It is a source of protein for beef cattle in an amount not to exceed 10% of the total diet. The maximum sulfur content must be guaranteed. (Proposed 2017)



#### **AAFCO**

- T71.35 Brassica carinata, Solvent Extracted
  - Tentative status
  - Become final in ~ one year?
  - Other species will need data to modify definition
  - Other manufacturing processes new submission for new definition
- AAFCO Product Investigator
  - Bob Church, Montana



### **Ingredient Approvals**

- Speed of Approvals is slow
- Survey shows \$1.75 million in lost revenue for every year of delay in approval
- AFIA priority to improve review processes
  - Submission quality
  - Resources for FDA-CVM
  - Preserving AAFCO process and codifying AAFCO definitions
